In Favor of Waiver – 80

Opposed to Waiver – 24

Total Votes – 104



Denis Burns US Army Specialist

Born in 1939 In Albany, NY to Arthur and Gladys Burns. One sister, Jarylyn. In high school, he swam, played basketball and ran track. Attained rank of Eagle Scout with 28 merit badges. Became a Scout Master. He graduated from high school in 1958 and attended Ivytech Community College in Guilderland, NY, achieving his associates degree in HVAC in 1968. He joined the Sheet Metal Workers Union and worked for a highly specialized air conditioning company for 35 years. He was promoted to management early on and oversaw 41 technicians. He retired at age 57, went back to work as a water safety instructor for the YMCA for 8 years.

His military service started while he was in high school, joining the Army Reserve in 1956 at the age of 17. His teenage imagination saw this as an opportunity to make some money part time. He went to his first summer training while still in high school and got paid! After graduating from high school, he went to boot camp at Fort Dix, NJ and then to military occupational specialty (MOS) training for six months where he became a wheeled vehicle mechanic.

His first assignment was to an Active Reserve Combat Engineer unit. Later, he was reassigned to the Medical Corps as an ambulance repair man. Eventually, this led to being trained as a US Army medic. His unit was alerted for the Bay of Pigs and the Cuban missile crisis but was not deployed. Honorably discharged, 1964.

He married Dee in 1962 and has three children, Michael, Kevin and Kathleen. He moved into Pine Lakes in 2015 and is an active member of the Pine Lakes Veterans Association.

Oh! He added off-handedly that he had run in the Boston Marathon and the NY City Marathon. No big deal, right?
