

As many of you are aware, I am not seeking re-election to the board. It has been my great pleasure to serve with this board for the past five years as well as the two years before.





SPOTLIGHT ON OUR VETERANS Denny Miner

Bill Roberts, Seaman 3rd Class Interior Communications Technician

Bill and I had an interesting interview. He had prepared a bit of a bio, and we went through it, elaborating on a few of his military experiences. It starts with Bill being born in November 1940. He joined the US Navy in April 1958 while still in high school and attended weekly drills. He graduated from high school in June '58 and volunteered for regular boot camp. He was sent to the Great Lakes Training Center in Chicago where he graduated in October '58 and returned home to his weekly meetings.

On January 20, 1959, he was assigned to the USS Samuel B. Roberts, DD823 in Newport, Rhode Island. His first cruise was on the 21st, taking the ship out of port. The next day the Captain apologized to him for the rough weather on his maiden cruise. He got seasick. In June of '59 he was part of the first modern warship cruise through the New St. Lawrence Seaway. He didn't get seasick. From October '59 to May of '60 he was aboard for routine North Atlantic Seventh Fleet exercises. He got seasick every time they left port, except one.

In May of '60 he was able to attend an Olympic track and field event while in Rome. While sailing through the Suez Canal on their way to the Red Sea, he heard a pinging sound, like small arms hitting the ship. Sure enough, two riders on camels were shooting at them. They did not return fire.

Battle stations manned. A Russian sub had surfaced off the port side of his ship. When the Russians realized that they had surfaced alongside a US Navy ship, they sounded General Quarters and dove. Bill's ship followed the sub across the Mediterranean and through the Straits of Gibraltar where another US Navy ship that followed it to Cuba during the Cuban missile crisis.

Bill returned to Newport in September 1960 and got married in October of that year. He has four children. He was released from active duty in January, '61 and started attending weekly meetings for the next two and a half years. He was honorably discharged from the Navy in April 1964. He found work as an electrician, a field he enjoyed for a lifetime. He had his own company for 13 years.



Some places of interest that he was able to visit were Barcelona, Spain, Gibraltar, Rome, Athens, Monte Carlo, Marseilles and Nice, France, and the oil fields of Saudi Arabia, where they fed him a camel steak dinner (Delicious).

His fondest memory was made in France. While on a pass in France, he went for a walk towards the outskirts of the city. The road turned from paved to dirt. As he passed a small farmhouse, a middle-aged couple and their two children waved at him. He waved back. They motioned for him to join them on their porch. They didn't speak English, and he didn't speak French but they shared their lunch of cheese, bread and wine with him. He thanked them as best he could and returned to his ship. "I had seen the real people of France."

He moved to Pine Lakes in October 2003. It was clear that Bill is quite proud of his service and enjoys remembering his time serving.
